## **3<sup>rd</sup> International Random Film Festival Program Announced**

The program for 3<sup>rd</sup> International Random Film Festival, happening in Anija, Estonia, in March, has been selected. All together we received 524 submissions from 70 countries, of which 26 were selected to be shown at the festival (list of selected movies on page 2). Our jury this year consisted of 25 playful children, who each were to select a colorful ball with a movie-sticker, which eventually made up this years program.

The International Random Film Festival is the first film festival in the world which celebrates randomness in cinema, aims to raise critical thinking about established conventions on film festivals and gives young filmmakers an opportunity to experience a film festival. IRFF is organized annually in a randomly selected location, on a random opening date. Awards are given out randomly.

The 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> editions of IRFF were held in Germany and Poland respectively and the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition of IRFF will take place in the village of Anija, Estonia (population: 128). The festival will be opening on the 10th of March 2012. The location and date of the next edition of IRFF were selected at the end of the closing ceremony of our 2011 festival by using Wikipedia Random Article Button, and the Random Number Generator at random.org.
